Gwyn and Cambell Carbines.

During the Civil War War years a small arms manufacturer In Hamilton Ohio applied to the War Department for a Government contract to supply Carbines for the Cavalry. The government being unable to supply enough arms fast enough granted contracts to private firms. Contracts were awarded for 9500 arms. The company had to build a factory , hire employees and proceed to produce this large quantity quickly. The end of the war demand sealed the fate of this and many other small manufacturers who had received Govt. Contracts went into large scale production. Mr Gwyns final years in Springfield as a traveling salesman for farm equipment, in the Netherlands on a sales trip, because Springfield was on the cutting edge of farm equipment manufacturing. Mr Campbell in Hamilton from a prestigious family died from suspected alcohol poisoning.

Update on Fairborn Military Veterans Memorial Project

Site of the memorial is on the corner of Central Avenue and West Hebble Avenue, Fairborn, Ohio

The dedication of the Obelisk for the Fairborn Military Veterans' Memorial took place on Saturday, December 2, 2023. The obelisk is a six-sided, ten-foot tall granite structure that depicts local Veterans and pieces of military equipment from each branch of the military on the different sides. The obelisk dedication ceremony on December 2, 2023 was attended by a number of the Veterans depicted on the obelisk along with family members, friends and local and state elected officials. The next phase of the Veterans Memorial will take place in the next month or two with the placement of bricks and benches around the obelisk. The Fairborn Military Veterans Memorial Project committee is working with the City of Fairborn to also bring lighting to the obelisk that will allow it to be lit up during hours of darkness.

The **mission of the Fairborn Military Veterans Memorial Project** is to promote, design, and develop a new permanent memorial honoring military service members who lived in Fairborn, Osborn, Fairfield, Bath Township and Wright-Patterson AFB areas - especially those service members who died in the service of their country.








A note from Mark Conrad, President & Curator ~
